BLASTING VOICE is an exhibition conceived and developed by Ashland Mines. For the main gallery space, Mines, in collaboration with Thunder Horse Video, designed a stage with an over-equipped sound system to accommodate a single performer. On nine nights throughout the show, this stage will be activated by 27 performances — both linguistic and non-verbal, acoustic and electronic — exploring poetic and formal dimensions of amplification.

Ashland Mines was born in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, and is now based in Los Angeles. He has created several ongoing environments involving a range of collaborators and participants, including WILDNESS at The Silver Platter (2008-10, with Asma Maroof, Daniel Pineda, and Wu Tsang) and GROWN at Dinner House M (2010-11, with Zane Reynolds and Wu Tsang), both in Los Angeles. He programs and mixes music at the weekly party Mustache Mondays (2008-present, with Ignacio Nava and Josh Peace) at La Cita in Los Angeles and is a regular contributor to New York's GHE20 GOTH1K and other events around the world. In late summer 2012, a double LP compilation curated by Mines will be released by Teenage Teardrops. BLASTING VOICE is his first exhibition in New York.

The exhibition was initiated by Kevin McGarry and Isabel Venero. Kevin McGarry is a writer based in Los Angeles and New York, and co-organizer of Migrating Forms film festival at Anthology Film Archives. Isabel Venero is a New York-based editor who works closely with contemporary artists developing and producing books on their work.
